Over the past six years, my colleague Deke Erh and I have done both research and writing on the Jewish refugees in Shanghai. When we started on this path we could find only one book in English about the subject, **Japanese, Nazis & Jews - The Jewish Refugee Community of Shanghai, 1938 - 45** by David Kranzler (Yeshiva University Press, New York, 1976). That invaluable work is now out of print, but since that time other books have been published which have also proved of great assistance to us in our research. We would like to share with you here the ones we found useful (listed chronologically, by publishing date).

**Deliverance in Shanghai** by Jerome Agel and Eugene Boe (Dembner Books, 1841 Broadway, New York 10023, 1983). Though fictional, this book is based in part on interviews with survivors of the Shanghai ghetto, on translations of unpublished documents, and on journals of Americans stationed in Shanghai during and immediately after World War II.
